#### OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT FROM OCTOBER 14, 2018

One family was helped with electricity this month.

#### A Place to Sleep

- 227 children have received beds in 2018 making a total of 1686 children having received beds with 74 on the waiting list.

- A Place to Sleep received more than \$5000 from "Give for Good" on September 13.

- The next delivery date will be October 28 with the help of Christ Community Church on their "Love Shelbyville" day.

#### Give a Kid a Brighter Day

- Cadence will be sorting costumes and books over Fall Break and will deliver these to the Home for the Innocents in Louisville.

#### **Serenity Center**

This church is volunteering at the Serenity Center on 7<sup>th</sup> Street the first Wednesday of each month. Youth under 16 must be supervised by an adult to volunteer. Carlen Pippin shares extra food with God's Kitchen, Colonial Hall, and the Women's Renaissance Center.

#### **Musical Instrument Ministry**

A cello and a violin were received making the total of 105 instruments that have been donated and placed in the schools.

#### God's Kitchen

Our most recent day serving lunch was on October 11. We appreciate the volunteers who continue to help supply food and come to serve: Mary & Gary Steinhilber with potato soup, Boyd Phillips with bean soup, Berry and Elaine Lane with cornbread, and Susie Phillips with bologna sandwiches, applesauce and dessert. There were no leftovers. The next day for us to serve will be November 8. Anyone with desserts should bring them to the church by 10:00 a.m., and those wishing to help serve should be at Victory Baptist by 10:30 a.m.

#### **Christmas Baskets**

We will again prepare and deliver 50 Christmas baskets. The date of this activity will be December 15. The congregation can help by donating money to cover costs, bring canned goods for "extra" items, and bring new or gently used toys. Also, Susie is working now, so Boyd may need extra help this year.




